

About C-CAP

Careers through Culinary Arts Program (C-CAP) works with public schools across the country to prepare underserved high school students for college and career opportunities in the restaurant and hospitality industry. A national nonprofit organization founded in 1990 by renowned chef and author, Richard Grausman, C-CAP manages the largest independent high school culinary scholarship program in the United States and has awarded students \$28 million in scholarships and donated \$2.3 million worth of supplies and equipment to classrooms.

C-CAP provides training and curriculum enrichment programs including: teacher training; scholarships and cooking competitions; job shadows, job training, internships, and career advising; college advising and college 101; and product donations.

In the 2008-09 academic year, C-CAP served 241 high school teachers in 173 public schools to enhance the education and employment opportunities of the 12,050 students enrolled in their classes. C-CAP donated \$113,242 worth of supplies and equipment to the participating schools, offered college and career advising to 1,250 students, and awarded nearly \$3 million in scholarships.

C-CAP operates programs in seven locations: New York; Los Angeles; Chicago; Philadelphia; Hampton Roads, VA; Prince George's County, Maryland/Washington, D.C.; and statewide in Arizona. For more information about C-CAP, visit www.ccapinc.org.
